Introduction

This document outlines the proposed training workshop for all users of Turnitin in Iceland on Feedback Studio

The training will be a combination of presentations and interactive tasks. Throughout the sessions, we will look at the different features within Feedback Studio in order to understand exactly how to interpret similarity reports, use different forms of feedback, create rubrics and use them to grade work, set up peer review assignments and (for Moodle users) create groups for group submissions. The training will include opportunities for the participants to discuss the merits of the functions with regards to the institution workflow and processes.

High Schools and Universities in Iceland have been using Turnitin for a number of years. Our aim is to ensure all users understand how to use the system and the benefits it can bring to day to day teaching activities.
